

WOMAN OPPOSES MARRIED TEACHERS

Says a Wife's Place Is at Home
With Her Hus-
band.

CHICAGO, July 19.—Mrs. John J. McMahon, formerly a school teacher and the only woman member of the Board of Education, says the married woman teacher should go.

"Her time belongs to her husband and whether she wishes it or not she gives her time to him.

"A woman who has a child is especially undesirable as a teacher for the fact that it is absolutely impossible for her to be a school teacher and mother at the same time. When a woman takes a husband it is impossible for her to give her best efforts to teaching," said she.

There are almost 800 married teachers in the Chicago schools.
