Designed to provide the "other side of the story", ENW titles offer alternative viewpoints from those proffered by the mainstream press. With an unequaled collection of articles, editorials, columns and reviews from different and unique perspectives, Ethnic NewsWatch is an essential interdisciplinary and multi-lingual resource for any academic or public library serving the needs of a diverse American population.

### African American Content

**In addition to broader ethnic coverage, African American/ African / Caribbean publications represent 37% of the article content. The combination of newspaper and journal coverage and regional strengths make this an exception research tool.**

- Provides the perspectives of the African American press, with coverage of the events and issues that from a local, regional and national level
- Deep backfile yields extensive search results, with comprehensive coverage dating back to early 1990's (to 1960 with the addition of ENW: A History)
- 81 titles specific to African Americans
- Strong newspaper content provides primary narrative of events
- Search by Ethnic Group feature allows users to make comparisons to other ethnic groups
- Includes publications from major metropolitan areas such as New York, Los Angeles, Washington, D.C., and Atlanta as well as smaller communities

## Sample Searches for Ethnic NewsWatch African American Content

**Search for:** The effect of Clinton's empowerment zones on African Americans, Native Americans and Hispanics and how attitudes toward the program have changed.

By adding a date range (>1/1/2000) in the advanced search, the user can choose to look at current developments in the economic program started in 1997.

**Search for:** Information regarding black journalists' careers and issues they face while reporting from the field and from the newsdesk.

This is a broad search. User could refine the search by adding **career\*** in Words in Article. Users can read about Philippa Duke Schuyler, the first African American woman journalist to report on the war in Vietnam and Ethel Payne, known as the "first lady of the Black press," who was memorialized on a U.S. postage stamp titled "Women in Journalism."
