## Sample Searches for Ethnic NewsWatch Hispanic Content

**Search for:** Articles concerning agriculture within the Hispanic community, both in English and in Spanish.

**SUBJECT:** AGRICULTURE/AGRICULTURAL  
**ETHNIC GROUP:** Hispanic  
**LANGUAGE: OF ARTICLE:** [do 2 searches - Spanish and English]

The important result here is that there are very few articles in English about agriculture, but hundreds in Spanish. Agriculture is more of an issue among the Spanish speaking community than the English speaking community.

---

**Search for:** Information regarding student activism among Hispanics

**WORDS IN ARTICLE:** Student NEAR activism  
**ETHNIC GROUP:** Hispanic

Results show how easy it is to obtain targeted information. Choose print/export function and citation for all documents and the student/patron can print out bibliographic information to use for their research.

---

**Search for:** Hispanic contributions to art

**SUBJECT:** ART  
**ETHNIC GROUP:** Hispanic  
**LANGUAGE:** English

Sort results by relevancy in descending order.

This search will highlight the artistic contributions of the Hispanic community. You can also search Dance as subject and Spanish language and get good results.

**Search for:** Articles from a specific publication

**PUBLICATION NAME:** EL DIARIO/LA PRENSA

Select any article and click on the masthead to get to publication information. Scroll down, *El Diario* has an interesting write up. Originally founded as *La Prensa* in New York City 1913, it was the first Hispanic daily in the U.S. *El Diario/La Prensa* remains politically independent. Its editorials, written in both Spanish and English, have caused city, state and federal agencies to react and take action on issues brought to the forefront by an award winning newsroom staff.
