Titles include *Fort Apache Scout*, *Indian Country Today*, *News from Indian Country*, *the Seminole Tribune* and *Tribal College Journal of American Indian Higher Education*.

Search for: A reading list of titles published on Native Americans

TYPE OF ARTICLE: Book Review

Small press titles are often hard to find and seldom make the bestseller lists. This type of search reveals many resources students may not find through other database sources.

Search for: Information regarding the Indian Land Consolidation Act

WORDS IN TITLE: Indian Land Consolidation Act
ETHNIC GROUP: Native People

Sort results by date in descending order. The articles detail the debate that grew out of the 1983 Indian Land Consolidation Act and the amendment that was made to it in the year 2000.

Search for: Editorials on Native Culture

SUBJECT: CULTURE/ETHNICITY (HERITAGE, NATIVE/INDIGENOUS)
ETHNIC GROUP: Native People
TYPE OF ARTICLE: Editorial

Results will include a range of editorials, including ones on saving the Cherokee language, property rights and the growing number of Central and South American Indians migrating to the U.S. International issues are raised as well, providing students with a much broader perspective on the cultural issues facing indigenous people.

Search for: Information regarding the Quebec Separatist movement

WORDS IN ARTICLE: Quebec AND independence
ETHNIC GROUP: Native People
TYPE OF ARTICLE: "Article" OR "Column" OR "Editorial"

Results will include articles giving the Native perspective on how Quebec independence will affect the status of treaties and ongoing court cases. There is a great deal of concern about their traditional lands being taken from them.
