


With eLibrary® Canada you are able to utilize three different search methods: **Natural Language**, **Boolean Searching** and **Topic Searching**.

## TOPIC SEARCHING

Topic Search works much like Web topic searches, but with the following advantages:

- It lists the most commonly researched school subjects
- It's faster because all Topic Tree terms link right to the content in our own database
- We constantly update the database with the most recent search queries
- You have access to over 160,000 ProQuest Homework Central Web sites that have been hand selected by our editor's.

## BROWSE THE TOPIC TREE
